Steven L. Denker, Rabbi, joined the Temple Emanu El family in 2004. He is known for developing personal relationships with congregants of all ages. Rabbi Denker can be found holding an infant during services or on the floor at eye-level with preschoolers during Tot Shabbat. Rabbi Denker's humor and warmth is exhibited on the bema, in the classroom and when he visits congregants and their families in the hospital or in other times of need. Rabbi Denker delivers spiritual services and witty intellectual sermons, while maintaining a family-friendly atmosphere.



Daniel A. Roberts, Rabbi Emeritus, has been a leader of our congregation with a passion for Judaism for over 40 years. His longevity has served as a bridge from the past to the present. He has seen congregants through lifecycle events from Consecration to B'nai Mitzvah to marriage. His leadership both within the Temple family and the greater community is constantly demonstrated. An expert in the field of bereavement, Rabbi Roberts often lectures locally, nationally and internationally on death and dying. 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WORSHIP & RITUAL

Temple Emanu El is an observant Reform congregation which offers an assortment of *Shabbat* and holiday/festival worship services. Our *Shabbat* services generate warmth and spirituality. This special feeling of community in prayer, song and worship encourages members to actively participate in services and share life-cycle celebrations.



Shabbat Services

Friday evening services are held weekly at 6:15 pm with a Pre-Reception held prior to services at 5:45 pm. Frequently, we hold special *Shabbat* services that feature our Chai Band, our Youth Choir, award presentations, special discussion topics, student participation and more. We offer a variety of interesting themes and topics that have included; Broadway Comes to Shul, The Music and Meditation of Shlomo Carlebach, a discussion on Israeli elections, and presentations of our annual *Tikkun Olam* awards.

Shabbat morning services are held weekly at 10:30 a.m. Once a month, we hold our *Shabbat B'Yachad* (*Shabbat Together*) service. This is an interactive, multi-generational service followed by a congregational brunch.

Additionally, *Tot Shabbat Services* are offered monthly. These memorable services for younger children combine a short service with stories and songs along with a themed activity, crafts and a snack.

Weekly Torah Study

Join a lively and diverse community that meets and explores the Torah each *Shabbat* morning with Rabbi Denker from 9:00 a.m. until 10:30 a.m. Bring an open mind and discover the amazing relevance that our ancient text has to modernity.

High Holy Day Services

The High Holy Days are celebrated with a memorable blend of traditional prayer and inspirational holiday music. Adding a warm community feeling to our High Holy Days, post *B'nai Mitzvah* students often participate in the *Torah* service. Adults and children of all ages are welcome to attend our services. In addition, a youth service led by teens is offered simultaneously while supervised activities and childcare is available for children ages eighteen months to 6 years old during these services. EDUCATION

At Temple Emanu El, we encourage and challenge learners of all ages, abilities and backgrounds to discover the spiritual, religious and cultural treasures of our tradition. We strive to create an inviting educational environment in which everyone can participate.

Religious School

Our Religious School, accredited by the Association of Reform Jewish Educators, encourages our PreK through Grade 12 students to make informed choices so that they can develop a sense of faith in their lives found through love of God, study of Torah and identification with



the Jewish people. We consider education to be a life-long process that emphasizes the partnership between parents, synagogue and school. Our clergy and faculty, along with

Education Director, Marla Wolf, instill the importance of doing mitzvoth and provide engaging lessons that teach our students about *Torah*, *Avodah* (finding sacred connections) and *G'milut Chasadim* (acts of loving kindness).

We also partner with parents to find enriching ways our students can live Jewishly. Students have the opportunity to engage in *T'filah* (prayer) with our clergy, draw closer to God and study *Ivrit* (Hebrew) in order to understand the meaning behind the prayers we say on Shabbat, Holy Days and lifecycle events. Together, students find meaningful ways to connect to *Eretz Yisrael* (Israel) and learn about the *chagim* (holidays). We believe in helping our children enrich their Jewish

experience outside the classroom as well. We strongly encourage attendance at Jewish overnight camps and travel to Israel to help reinforce our children's Jewish identities and to broaden their Jewish education. Thanks to generous donors, provisions for Israel travel and camp scholarships are available.

Preschool & Childcare

Our Judaically-oriented program provides a safe, nurturing and supportive environment in which preschoolers can learn to play and socialize. Personal contact with the clergy fosters a sense of Jewish identity and encourages the learning of basic Jewish traditions.

Open to children ages 3 months through Pre-Kindergarten, our program includes the use of our private playgrounds, music and gym classes, library time, daily art and science activities and more.

Under the direction of Katie Theobald, the Preschool is a 3 star Step-Up-To-Quality program. Open weekdays from 7:30 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. TEE Preschool offers half and full day programs. A kosher-style hot lunch and snacks are provided.

Adult Education

We offer a variety of learning opportunities that included Jewish literature, Jewish music, Holocaust education, Bible studies, Yiddish and Hebrew classes and more. We also hold ongoing Torah study, books clubs, speakers and discussions groups.



CONSTITUENT GROUPS

Temple Emanu El is a *haimish* congregation. People visit. They feel at home. They stay. We provide activities to nourish our congregants spiritually, intellectually and socially through these constituent groups as well as others.

Brotherhood

TEE Brotherhood offers members the opportunity for working, learning and socializing with a group of dedicated Jewish men who provide service and support to our Religious School, youth group, congregation and the community at large. Programs and speakers have included the US Attorney for the Northern District of Ohio, a baseball historian, a representative from NASA, and more. Community building, networking and socializing are a part of activities including poker tournaments, sporting events, beer tasting, a night at the Schvitz, a trip on the Goodtime III and most notably, the Annual Sports Night which brings in local sports personalities, executives, and players.

Women of Temple Emanu El

The Women of Temple Emanu El (WOTEE) is a multi-generational group that brings women together for social, spiritual, educational and fundraising events. We offer a new member luncheon, guest speakers, mystery trips, Torah study, book reviews and more. WOTEE is involved in a wide array of activities including sponsoring our weekly Oneg Shabbat and donating gifts.



TEMTY & JTEEE Youth Groups

TEMTY is Cleveland's most active Reform temple youth group offering social, educational and religious experiences for students in grades 9 to 12. Our Junior Youth Group is for our students in grades 6 to 8. Programs including youth-led services, retreats, *Tikkun Olam* projects, planning the annual Purim Carnival and more providing an opportunity to meet and socialize with other Jewish students locally and nationally.

Tikkun Olam Committee

This committee plans and promotes community service programs and social action including food, clothing, toys and toiletries collections for local organizations as well as to bring to Israeli soldiers; volunteering at food pantries and soup kitchens; and involvement in the Greater Cleveland Congregations.

Kehilat Chesed (Caring Committee)

Based upon our rich Jewish tradition, this committee promotes a culture of caring by providing support, solace and hope to congregants and their families during times of illness, loss or need, as well as recognizing their joyful milestones and accomplishments.
