This week's Torah portion, Parshat Korach, always strikes me on so many levels. It deals with miracles, an earthquake, a plague, rebellion, and the presence of God. Many say that it is symbolic of a revolutionary change in the Israelite Priesthood. Korach is the name of the Torah Portion and is also the name of a Levite priest who rebelled against Moses. Korach happens to be a cousin of Moses. After studying this portion, many people associate the name Korach with rebellion. Rebellion is something parents and teens deal with regularly.
